 - Swag Bags: Judith at the Wisconsin Council for the Blind and Visually Impaired has offered to fill 150 informational bags for the fair. Please bring 150 informational items to the next LHC meeting (October 27, 2016) or bring them directly to the WCB at 754 Williamson Street, Madison – 608-255-1166. If you have less than 150, bring them anyway and they can be added to some of the bags. The intention is to take 45 minutes or so after the October 27th meeting to stuff the bags.

The age range is preschool and grade school level readers and includes both Spanish and English language books.
